


What Can I Do If My Child Needs Extra Help?


If your child does not achieve the minimum passing requirements for a particular topic, it could be that this topic has not yet been taught in class. In any case, there are a few things that you can do using the tools provided at Study Island.

1. Click on your child's scores in a category that he or she has not achieved proficiency.
2. A **Pop-Up Window** (see below) will appear giving you more detail about their performance.
3. It tells you how many times your child attempted to work on this topic, their scores, the amount of time that was spent, as well as the opportunity to view the specific types of questions your child had difficulty with.

4. Go back to the Main Menu.
5. Click on the 'lesson' next to the topic that your child is having difficulty. The lesson will give detailed explanations on the types of questions that appear in the test.
6. Match these explanations up with the types of questions your child missed.
7. You can also print out worksheets that will give your child extra practice before going back in to retake that topic. **To print out worksheets:** After selecting a topic, select *printable worksheet* from the Session Type pull down menu.
